## Families often form into roles when they are dysfunctional.

#### The Enabler



Close to addict, allow them to continue destructive behavior and provide them support as they spiral downward.

#### The Hero



Often the oldest in the family, seen as a success and 'having it together'. May be involved in many activities but struggle internally.

#### The Scapegoat



The Scapegoat is the focus of attention in the family for trouble. They don't seem to care about consequences.

#### The Lost Child



This role of often occupied by the quiet child. They refrain from talking to stay out of trouble. "Out of sight, out of mind".

#### The Mascot



Often taken by the youngest child. The family tries to protect this member from the reality of issues within group.



## Family Addiction And The Roles We Play.



The Addict: "I'm the one with the problems and using makes them seem to go away."



The Hero: "I'll make everything on the outsides look perfect because that's easier than looking at my insides"



The Mascot: "If I make people laugh I can distract us all from hard feelings."



The Enabler: "I'm concerned about what will happen if things change around here... so I'm going to keep things going the same way."



The Lost Child: "If I stay quiet and emotionally distant, I won't get hurt or have to look at feelings."



The Rebel: "If I act out, maybe someone will help me with my emotions."



The Caretaker: "If I take care of someone (everyone) else, then I don't have to think about my feelings"

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
